	mainly still seeing cases in younger age groups where symptoms	
	seem to be less severe. We are seeing pushbacks on false	
	positives, still relatively low. There are 3 <sup>rd</sup> party labs that are not	
	tied into state reporting system. The state is working on	
	developing guidance on antigen testing, not as sensitive as PCR	
	test. The Muskegon COVID prison outbreak was discussed.	
	o 2 horses in the region have tested positive for EEE	
	o Mosquito pools have tested positive for west nile	
	o Immunization rates have declined during the pandemic,	
	concerns of vaccine preventative diseases re-emerging were	
	discussed.

#### b. Education

- o The exercise plan was reviewed at the meeting.

## c. Hospital

- o COVID response and identifying supply chain issues were discussed at last meeting. There was a survey sent out about what items the region should stockpile, this needs to be completed by hospitals.
- o CAPR special funding was discussed and hospital groups recommendation was to present CAPR special funding request to the coalition for approval.
- o The pediatric exercise that is taking place in September was discussed, EMS and CME credits will be available.

## d. Regional MCA/ EMS

- o EMS is still experiencing shortages with personnel and transport capabilities.
- o PPE levels are going well right now, the biggest thing they are expecting to be an issue is glove shortages.
